

At the end of 2017 going into 2018, we have continued to follow through with set goals planned for the New Year, starting off with the priority of getting the church building and meeting room carpeted. Thank you to Violet and Grant in arranging the quotes with Carpet Court and discussions regarding payment options – Cost \$11,227.20

The carpet was laid down on the 25/01/18, and a short blessing was officiated by Rev. Gary, elders and youth volunteers to move back the Organ and Piano back to their new positions at the front of the church.

Church Maintenance – Completed.

- At the March working bee, trees were sawed down mainly around Phoenix House and the surrounding areas of the church grounds. Special thanks to Afoa Tuuga-Stevenson for his chain-saw which allowed our job to be much easier for loading into the skip, a huge thank you to by Fou Purcell and family for providing this.
- Continued leaking caused by the latest storms, we had damage in the church foyer with water leaking from the roof. Kowhai Roofing was called in to access the damage and repairs to the Valley on the roof was replaced – Cost \$5,405.00
- A leak to a cracked pipe caused a pool of water to build up behind the church hall and manse garden area. This prompted by a huge rise in the water bill. Heron Plumbing called in to access and repair 16/05/18 – Cost \$621.68

Manse

- A request for 2 x Heat Pumps to be installed in the Manse were quoted and installed by Retro Fit –
 Cost \$5,570.00 payable over a 9-year period.
- As advised by Rev. Gary, he discovered water leaking between the shower and toilet areas. The
 hallway carpet was sodden to walk on and going into the bedrooms. Heron Plumbing was called in to
 access and locate the leak, the Hot water cylinder has been leaking down the walls causing the
 flooding onto the carpet.
- Jae Cleaning Services called in to dry out the carpet with heat blowing machines, this resulted in having to lodge an insurance claim approximately \$2000.00

Thank you to Brian Galbraith, who again has volunteered his time to repair the walls within the hot water cupboard etc.

Phoenix House

A huge thank you to Onosai Nanai and Ashleigh Hemana who kindly donated the costs to have chains added to the posts already erected up at Phoenix House.



Work still in progress are:

- Working Bees to be held more frequently due to the winter months, clearing of gutters and debris, checking of drains regarding water flow.
- Fundraising efforts for the remainder of 2018.

Mainly Music

We meet each Wednesday at 10am in the Church for our Mainly Music session then progress to the hall for morning tea and a playgroup activity then back to the church for the children to play. We are also a registered playgroup with the Ministry of Education therefore receive funding and gained registration for another 3 years in August 2017 which expires August 2020. Mainly Music are about to increase their membership fee, the first time in 15 years. As at Term 3 2018 we are asking families to donate \$4.00 a session.

We currently have 42 children on our roll. At the moment we have a few caregivers that sometimes have 4 children in their care. We have also had the local Childcare Bright Eyes attend a session. Some weeks we have 30 children attending, most people just bringing one child apart from our caregivers bringing more.

We are very lucky to have a dedicated and talented team. We said farewell to Amanda Bridges in December 2017 when her daughter Abi turned 5, Amanda was a big part of our team. Gabrielle a parent leads our music sessions most weeks. Gabe is very vibrant and puts her soul into the sessions and gets others involved. Gabe son Lachlan turns 5 in February 2019, so we will lose Gabrielle at the end of the year. Gabrielle's father Bob also has been helping us, Bob is great for all those man chores, the stuck PVA bottle, those heavy tables! The Kerr/Johnson families provide great help and support and their extended family has been attending MM at St Andrews since the beginning.

Nomes Dixon also leads the music sessions, Nomes is young and good with technology. Nomes recently run a session off her cell phone playing music when our laptop decided to update at 10am on Wednesday morning. Caty Ferguson attended and helped out for the first term of 2018. Claire Kelly helps when she can usually at packing up time. Isabel Clarke looks after the props during the session and pushing that vital button between songs and you often see Isabel with a child on her hip. She also helps Jean in the kitchen and sets up the toys for play time. Isabel reads to the children regularly at play time. Jean Pascoe works the kitchen and has for the last 11 years at MM @ St Andrews Henderson.

Catherine Connell is our Girl Friday does a bit of everything, Catherine comes from a child education background, so she is fabulous with the children. Catherine is a wonderful support to me and we always lock up at the end of the session together. Gary also attends when he can. Gary sometimes has other commitments happening on a Wednesday not always planned ones. I help where needed, manage the front desk and usually organise the weekly playgroup activity. It is lovely to have Tara and Mila-Rose attend each week.

We have many wonderful Wednesday Music Sessions. It's great to see the children joining in and learning the actions. Many children start off shy and gradually over time get more confident. We have a Theme Days at the end of each term, one being Spring, Christmas Celebrations, Easter, Teddy Bears Picnic and we are about to celebrate Matariki and our New Zealand Culture.

We are always looking for Volunteers to join our team. Please come along and see us on a Wednesday morning. This is a great outreach programme for St Andrews.

Treasurer's Report

Our overall offerings increased by \$3,764 this year over both envelope giving and direct giving. Many thanks to everyone for their continuing support and commitment. The shop income was up by \$4,212 on the previous year due to the introduction of EFTPOS, a good result with all the time and effort put in by the staff. Phoenix House income remains constant. As you can see these are two vital sources of income. Without them the Parish would not be viable. We had an overall deficit of \$2,711.

We would again encourage more people to take on direct giving either by automatic payment or direct credit, as this is an easy, regular way of offering. We would also remind you that the limit on tax rebates for charitable giving has been lifted, so we would ask you to consider giving your rebate to the Church for an even higher return the next year.

The annual St Andrew's Day appeal boosted our funds by \$1,301.00. This event is held each year as a special way to support the Church.

This year we continued our series of fund raising activities ably led by members of the Property and Finance Committee. The money raised will go towards the ongoing maintenance of our property. We still continue to meet in full our commitments to General Assembly and Northern Presbytery.

Thank you once again to everyone for their continuing commitment and support. Your contributions are much needed if we are to continue to be a viable parish with a full-time Minister.
