Faithbuilders



This year has been another great year at Faithbuilders. We have 30 children regularly attending our church. We have weeks where nearly all the children are at Faithbuilders, making a busy group for our leaders. A big thank you goes to our Faithbuilders leaders – Jenny, Nele, Nina and Suliana who join me taking the lessons and Nofo who looks after the crèche with our parents and grandparents. Our children would love to see some male helpers and leaders join them – have you noticed how many boys we have? They'd love to have some men come join them at Faithbuilder time.

Lessons

We have three groups again this year – Fantails – our Crèche group who have toys set up on the carpet in the hall; Kiwi – who are years 1-4 at school; and Moa who are years 5-8 at school. 

Mainly Music

We meet each Wednesday at 10am in the Church for our Mainly Music session then progress to the hall for morning tea and a playgroup activity then back to the church for the children to play. We are a registered playgroup with the Ministry of Education therefore receive funding. Our registration expires next year in August 2020 but can be renewed. We obviously come under the Mainly Music umbrella and pay a monthly levy to them and receive support and training from them in return.

We currently have 38 children on our roll. I have just completed Ministry of Education Statistics to the 30 June 2019. We have children attending from different ethnic groups such as Phillipino, Maori, Samoan, Chinese, Japanese, South African and the majority being NZ European. We still attract caregivers that sometimes have 4 children in their care. Our Mums that come with their children generally just have 1 child attending MM.

We are very lucky to have a dedicated and talented team. We said farewell to Jean Pascoe formally on December 18 after being our Mainly Music Tea lady for 11 years. Gabrielle's son Lachlan turned 5 so we also farwelled Gabrielle in December. Gabrielle bought a spark to our team and a willingness to do anything. We also said goodbye to Nomes Dixon last year as her family relocated to Wellington. We had Belinda helping us this year until May when her daughter Hannah started fulltime preschool. Bob has taken over Jeans kitchen duties, it's great to have a Grandfather on our team. Another Grandfather that helps us is Pava, he is a dab hand at placing all the children chairs back into place. Claire Kelly youngest child turned 5 in January, Claire had been coming to MM for 10 years and often helped us cleaning up at the end of the session. Isabel Clarke looks after the props during the session and pushing that vital button between songs and you often see Isabel with a child on her hip. All the children love Catherine and Isabel as they both interact greatly with the children at play time. Catherine comes from a child education background so she is fabulous with the children. Catherine is a wonderful support to me and we always lock up at the end of the session together and she takes home the dirty washing! We have also had Toots and Suliana join us in June. It is lovely to have more helpers from our congregation. Gary started the year off leading the MM sessions in February. We are very blessed to have Donna Teale who is now leading our weekly Music Sessions. Donna also comes with a preschool background. Donna's Mum Linda also comes weekly and joins in with Donna's daughter Mackenzie. I help where needed, manage the front desk and usually organise the weekly playgroup activity and report to the Ministry of Education.

We have many wonderful Wednesday Music Sessions. It's great to see the children joining in and learning the actions. Many children start off shy and gradually over time get more confident. One of my highlights this year has been a little boy start as a baby and now seeing him joining in the weekly sessions. It also lovely to see the children participant in the playgroup activities, a simple wand to make, play doh, finger-paint. A lot of our Mums and caregivers look forward to a Wednesday.

Donna, Catherine and I attended a MM workshop in May that we really enjoyed. Thanks to Caty, Jenny, Anne and Gary for chairing our MM Workgroup committee that meet a few times a year.

Treasurer's Report

There was an increase in our direct giving this year as more people have joined the scheme. However our overall offerings have decreased by \$3376. Many thanks to everyone for their continuing support and commitment. The shop EFTPOS income was up on the previous year, but the overall income was down by \$2853. Many thanks to all the time and effort put in by the staff. Phoenix House income remains constant. As you can see these are two vital sources of income. Without them the Parish would not be viable.

We would again encourage more people to take on direct giving either by automatic payment or direct credit, as this is an easy, regular way of offering. We would also remind you that the limit on tax rebates for charitable giving has been lifted, so we would ask you to consider giving your rebate to the Church for an even higher return the next year.

The annual St Andrew's Day appeal boosted our funds by \$2110.00. This event is held each year as a special way to support the Church.

We received from Northern Presbytery a grant of \$2000 towards upgrading of our computer hardware. This is to be used to purchase two laptops and the necessary software.

This year we continued on our series of fund raising activities ably led by members of the Property and Finance Committee. Many thanks to all those involved with work involved in getting these events together. The money raised will go towards the much needed ongoing maintenance of our property and other special purposes.

We still continue to meet in full our commitments to General Assembly and Northern Presbytery.

Thank you once again to everyone for their continuing commitment and support. Your contributions are much needed if we are to continue to be a viable parish with a full-time Minister.
