Greetings to you all in the Mighty Name of Jesus Christ.

Families and friends of St. Andrew's parish, we've made it through another year of regular worship gatherings, special events, retreats, meetings and celebrations. All this made possible by the grace of our loving God. Well done!

The past year has had its fair share of "hellos" and "farewells." Earlier this year we bade farewell to two long-serving families of our faith community. Peter and Shirley McLeavey and Alan and Diane Bussey made the move to Tauranga and are settling in well. Both families have contributed significantly to the life of St. Andrew's parish. Diane invested many years in the teaching of our Faithbuilders and Alan, an Elder, also led the maintenance of our church buildings. We are truly grateful for their participation and willingness to serve in various capacities. The seeds which they have sown throughout the years in the lives of our children and in the parish continue to be nurtured. True to their giving nature, both families presented the parish with a generous monetary gift. They continue to be loved and missed.

St. Andrew's also welcomed a few new faces to our faith community. It has been a pleasure seeing and meeting new people who share a desire to know God. Our prayer is that you may experience the presence of the Spirit in this space and through the people of this community.

This past year we have bid farewell to (and welcomed back) our Ministry Intern So'osemea, his wife Alice and the children, as they spent 6 months with Ranui PIPC. We are glad that we have the privilege of spending the next four months with them before So'o graduates from KCML in November of this year, with a Diploma in Ministry. So'o has been of great assistance to the preparing and leading of worship services. We continue to pray for the remainder of So'o's ministry formation. We also acknowledge the great support Alice and their children have been throughout this journey. God is still with you.

Sunday worship services have been a privilege to lead. It has been a real gift to be able to call upon So'o Fa'atui, Rev. Graeme Ferguson and Rev. Bruce Deverell to lead services often in my absence. On occasion, the parish Elders has coordinated the worship service. This year a reflection was shared by Linda Johns.

In 2016, sermons have focused on Christian character and how we can live, communicate, serve and worship better together in spirit and in truth. Following the readings provided by the Lectionary we have heard about the relationship between God and Israel. We have heard of a God who despite the

disobedience and wicked ways of His children, Israel, God's love for His people is "too strong." We needn't dwell then on our wrongs and pasts. We worship a Sovereign God who loves His people unconditionally.

The question for us then is, "how do we respond to such forgiving love?" Well, perhaps we can learn from the opening quote from Stanley Hauerwas:

"God is not only a calling God; but a sending God."

"No longer is the Sabbath one day, but the form of a people on the move."

We are not only called by a God who forgives and endorses a people of peace but we are also sent to share that peace with the world. God is not only a calling God; but a sending God. Our Christianity then is not only for display within our community who gather on a Sunday morning or evening rather a Christianity that extends beyond the confines of our church walls. However we need confidence first before we venture out to touch others. So, we learn to first eat alongside those with whom we regularly gather – our church family. We build up our confidence with every hearing of God's Word and with every interaction with your brother or sister sitting next to, beside, in front of, and behind you.

Once we can ground our confidence in Jesus and the Good News for all that comes through him, then we become more confident as Christians on every other day of the week. We become in Hauerwas' words "a people on the move." We become a people moving in faith, moving in growth, moving in service and growing in forgiveness, compassion and love. Jesus was always moving.

It has been very humbling witnessing the growth in faith and confidence this past year from our young Faithbuilders, StAND Youth and Seniors. The journey of faith and hope continues.

At the recent Elders Retreat those who were present imagined for a moment. As a result of these imaginings we were challenged to envision St. Andrew's parish as a community "on the move." Naturally, there was some sense of reluctance as we entertained the thought of building projects and necessary reviews of our assets. Thinking of stepping into the unknown will often tickle the pessimistic bone in us. But we are a faith community. Faith involves risk. And yes, risk will either bring about success or failure. Nevertheless, a community of faith will always succeed in all they do given they prayerfully discern that this is the will and direction of the Holy Spirit. If we try and it doesn't work – well, was there ever a time we learned anything from succeeding every time?

The Elders continue to listen for the still small voice of God and guidance from the Holy Spirit's murmurs. Of course, this is not just an Elders responsibility to seek the voice of God. As a result of the Retreat it was agreed that we would hold parish meetings to talk about how we as a collective can imagine being a church on the move. I would like to encourage you to imagine together with us – whether young or old, female or male, European, Samoan or Cook Island, a long-standing member or a recently sitting visitor. Let us imagine together.

Suliana and I wish to thank everyone for your continuing love for us. You show this in many forms. You continue to support us in things inside and outside of ministry. You have no idea how much your genuine concern for us carries us to love what we do in this community of St. Andrew's, Henderson.

I could not do much of what I do without a team of dedicated people with whom I work closely with. Thank you to the ministry team of Ailsa Freeman, Linda Johns and Grant Connell. It would take me a thousand years to learn what you do.

St. Andrew's has many parts and we are blessed to have volunteers who are already part of the church on the move. Thanks to the Parish Council for your relentless wrestling with matters of governance. Thanks to all Convenors of committees, members of committees and all who have lent a helping hand this year. Thanks, is also due to all the names on Cleaning, Flowers, Morning Tea, and Prayers for Others, Bible Reading and Faithbuilders Prayer rosters. To our Communion patrons and Organists/Pianists. 

ST ANDREWS PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH – PROPERTY & FINANCE REPORT AGM OCTOBER 2016

Praise God we have come through my second year at the helm. It has been a challenging year for our committee as we struggle to meet the aims and wish list we set for 2016 and going forward.

We are always crying out for volunteers and thank those who give their time and support when we have requested a helping hand.

The Property Finance team has been progressing throughout the year, working on the priority maintenance that has been occurring during the past months, with continued storms and winds making life difficult, not only here at St Andrews, but also in our own homes.

We work through the concerns as they arise, and continue to pray for the finances to be available for us to work through our list re. upgrades and maintenance of the church, hall and manse.

Since the last AGM we have completed the following:

Church Maintenance

A big thank you to Fou Purcell and her family for donating the use of the council bins in our last Working bee held last December. We cleared the grounds, washed the church building, dug and pulled out weeds and filled approx. 8 full wheelie bins. An expense of taking these to the tip, was no expense, which was gratefully appreciated.

Two storage cupboards were purchased and put together for the Stand Youth, who were in need of these and to give Gary and Suiliana their space in their garage back. The Youth also had products stored in the kitchen cupboards.

With the Bussey family moving to Tauranga, they kindly donated a Sound Mixer for the church as a parting gift. This was appreciated by all, especially the elders as it is a better unit to set up and use for our church services.

The men's toilet was blocked and had a leaky cistern. The plumbers were called out to inspect and repair. To date no invoice has been received.

A few months back we had a heavy storm which flooded the foyer and there was minimal damage to the ceiling. This did not warrant an accessor re. Insurance to make a claim.

As the heavy weather was causing overflowing from the downpipe, a new junction box has been built and replaced. This work was done voluntarily by a friend of Gary's who donated his time and materials, inspected the roof and advised of what we need to look at getting repaired, or to replace in the future.

Manse

The clothesline needed new wiring (lines). These were purchased and replaced, thanks to Gary for completing the repairs needed.

Repairs completed to the stove and light fittings as advised by Gary.

Phoenix House

A new Boiler unit was replaced in the kitchen, as the old one had rusted and was leaking badly.

Work still in progress are:

Looking to hold our next Working Bee before the end of the year to maintain any blockages of gutters and downpipes. To look at cutting down the tree behind the church, to alleviate the problem of falling leaves and debris.

There were chairs in the church identified that needed to be either repaired or replaced. Thank you to Ailsa who got in touch with the Chair Doctor and 15 or so chairs will be repaired.

We have other chairs needing stitching repairs, with the backs torn in places. Ailsa has offered to repair these by hand. We are thankful for the talented and beautiful cherubs at St Andrews.

Finally, we are having on-going discussions to look at fundraising events. We dearly would like to replace the carpets throughout the church building and offices.

I would like to thank Grant, Fou and, just recently our new volunteer, Violet, for their time and support for this committee. We would love to hear from anyone who would like to come join our little, but humble committee.

SHOP REPORT

The Church Shop is situated at 9 Trading Place, Henderson, and has been operating since September 1984. The Shop complex was sold in July 2014, but we have been told we could have four more years there. At some stage we will need an alternative venue.

We sell a wide range of good quality second-hand items including clothing, jewellery, bric a brac, household goods, books and furniture. There are always treasures to be found. We depend on the generosity of Church members and the public for donations of goods.

The shop is open from 10.00am to 2.00pm on Mondays, 10.00am to 4.00pm on Tuesdays to Fridays, and 10.00am to 12.00pm on Saturdays. These hours are working well.

Our voluntary helpers include members of St Andrew's and Henderson PIPC, as well as eight supportive friends – almost half the staff are not Church members. Extra helpers are always welcome, even for just an hour at a time. No experience is necessary.

Jean Pascoe is no longer able to work in the shop, but she still keeps in contact by doing the washing. We are very grateful for her help. We thank her for her many years of service.

Our congregation needs to show much more interest in the shop. If you are unable to help, come and visit us. Please let your families and friends know where we are, and encourage them to come and have a look at what we sell.

This year's takings are \$3339 less than last year's, which is very disappointing. The revenue gained from the shop is absolutely essential for running the Church.

Ailsa and Catherine continue to share the role of Shop Convenor, and the job is made easy by the cooperation of the staff.

The shop is a very important outreach in our community. Some customers come in regularly just to have a chat. We offer a listening ear, support and encouragement.

We are extremely grateful to all the staff members for their time and dedication. Everyone's contribution, no matter how small, is very much appreciated.

Faithbuilders Report

Once again I would like to say what a wonderful group of children we are lucky to have attending St Andrews. We have 28 regular attenders with several others occasionally attending.

Groups

This year we changed our groups around slightly, to create a crèche group for our pre-schoolers. This group is taken by Gaylene, and we are so thankful that she has continued to do this all year, with very little assistance.

Land – the land group are for the children in years 1-2 at school. This group is made up predominantly of boys, and so is high energy and a lot of fun. I have enjoyed taking this group all year with Nellie Taumate.

Sky – this group is made up of children in years 3-6 at school. This group is also full of energy, with some great discussions happening. Jenny and Nele and Sa'e have taken this group over this year.

Sea – this group is for our intermediate children. They have enjoyed some deep discussions and thought provoking Bible studies over this year. Some of this group will be heading to high school next year, and we will miss seeing them in our Faithbuilders each week. This group has been taken by Suliana and Nele, and sometimes they have stayed in church.

Themes

This year we have loosely followed the Scripture Union syllabus again for the older groups. The leaders have the flexibility to change or use their own ideas if this suits them best.

The Land group have followed a programme based around the main stories and people of the Bible. We create this using a children's Bible and just alternating themes between the New Testament and Old.

Theme Days

This year we introduced the idea of theme days that we invited the whole congregation to participate in. The first theme day was 'come dressed as your favourite Bible story' and was held in first term. The second theme was 'Noah's Ark' and was held in term 2. Third term will see a 'Spring Hat' theme, where we invite everyone to decorate a Hat to show support of our young people and their talents.

We meet each Wednesday at 10am in the Church Hall for our Mainly Music session then progress to the hall for morning tea and a playgroup activity then back to the church for the children to play. We are also a registered playgroup with the Ministry of Education.

We are averaging 25 children a session coming from around 20 families, mostly people just bringing along one child. We have 50 people enrolled. Numbers fluctuate with sickness, wet and fine weather. We get more takers when it's wet outside! We have several different ethnic groups attending.

We are very lucky to have a dedicated and talented team. We said farewell to Janette Donn at the beginning of the year. Janette had been involved for 8 years and the later years Janette led our team. Robyn Townsend and Gabrielle Johnson, two of our Mums, lead the Mainly Music sessions. They do a grand job, it takes a special person to stand up in front of adults and children to dance and sing. Amanda Bridges another Mum welcomes people at the front desk. Isabel Clarke looks after the computer during the session and you often see Isabel with a child on her hip. Jean Pascoe has nearly done 10 years in the kitchen. Catherine Connell is our Girl Friday. She does a bit of everything and Catherine is also our money liaison thru Grant. Gary also attends when he can and often brings his guitar. I help where needed, I'm great at colour matching chairs! We sort of have set jobs but can help each other when warranted.

We have many wonderful Wednesday Music Sessions. It's great to see the children joining in and learning the actions. Many children start off shy and gradually over time get more confident during the Sessions. The children love the songs that we use props and often all want a turn. We've had 2 successful High Teas this year. One was for Mothers Day and another this week. Just a little way to say a Caregivers Role is very important and appreciated. We also have meals on hand for people that may be going through challenging times and not always financially related. We have a Theme Day at the end of each term. These are very popular and often see bigger numbers attending. The end of this term we are holding a Teddy Bears Picnic.

We are actively looking for Volunteers to join our team. Please come along and see us on a Wednesday morning. This is a great outreach programme for St Andrews.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Our overall offerings increased by \$1857 this year with a rise in envelope giving and a decrease in direct giving. Many thanks to everyone for their support and commitment. The shop income was again down, this time by \$3339 on the previous year, a disappointing result with all the time and effort put in by the staff. Phoenix House income remains constant. As you can see these are two vital sources of income. Without them the Parish would not be viable.

One of our major expenses last year has been the ongoing rental for the Portacom building for our ever growing Faithbuilders. We had an overall deficit of \$1396.

We would again encourage more people to take on direct giving either by automatic payment or direct credit, as this is an easy, regular way of offering. We would also remind you that the limit on tax rebates for charitable giving has been lifted, so we would ask you to consider giving your rebate to the Church for an even higher return the next year.

The annual St Andrew's Day appeal boosted our funds by \$2295.00. This event is held each year as a special way to support the Church.

We were fortunate this year to receive a grant of \$10,000 from the St Martin's Trust to assist us with expenses in hosting our Ministry Intern.

We still continue to meet in full our commitments to General Assembly and Northern Presbytery.

Thank you once again to everyone for their continuing commitment and support. Your contributions are much needed if we are to continue to be a viable parish with a full-time Minister.
