Greetings in Jesus' mighty and most powerful name!

Kia ora, Kia Orana, Talofa, Salam, Malo e lelei, Fakalofa lahi atu,

I knew that sitting down to write an introductory piece to sum up this past year was always going to be quite the task. The year 2020 has by far been one of the most challenging in my 8 years of parish ministry. As I write this foreword there is a deadly pandemic sweeping the globe. Our nation of Aotearoa has done well to avoid some of the unimaginable casualty counts as broadcasted from across the waters. If you are reading this, consider yourself fortunate and blessed. What a privilege to be living today. However, our precaution in the early stages of this pandemic required us to be apart for some time. This was a testing time as our very identity is founded on community. The faith community, the Church, is one that seeks to exemplify and reflect the loving community and nature of the triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is no surprise that we would turn to our safety, our refuge, our salvation whom we have read and heard about this past year. With God's help our parish St. Andrew's responded accordingly. Physically apart our parish had glimpses of the early church in Acts. We became a church who from behind closed doors and with restricted movement navigated a new way of worship and unity. Our concern for our loved ones and for neighbours was boosted up a level. I know of several instances where parishioners and community groups were offering relief packages to families in need.

There is no doubt in my mind that the cries and lament of the Psalter (the Psalms) became more relatable to us in our time of uncertainty and high anxiety. As Biblical history has taught us God was faithful to his people. God delivered us from our suffering. Yet there are still so many who are affected by this pandemic.

Like that of the owl in the opening poem in some sense the lockdown can be understood as a period of seeing, listening, and hearing. Our doing was restricted. Our physical assisting of others was disabled. Our practical forms of serving and pastorally caring for others prohibited. Life with less outside noise and the hustle and bustle of work reduced us to listeners, hearers, and seers. If you were anything like me, your day would have included tuning in to the Prime Minister's daily updates. It was part of what we were listening out for. Reassurance of our safety. Time with family was now substituted with online video calls and the like. Our routine hugs and kisses for our family members now reduced to seeing faces on flat screens. In a kingdom sense, a life with less distraction provided

for us the space we needed to listen out for God. To see what God was doing throughout the world. As difficult as it was to see anything past the tragedy and sorrow that had befallen our world we did not need to look far to see where God was. Through our essential workers, some from within our own parish, medical staff, relief providers, hospitals, and all who were involved in scrambling to deal with the overwhelming need for assistance and services – there God was. Showing compassion for the dying and strengthening the helpers. I pray that during this time many more people around the world would have cried out to a once unknown God. For in Him, those who lose their life for the sake of Christ, will find life. (Matt. 16:25) God has been with us all along.

Family of God, I strongly believe that we cannot experience an event so unprecedented without it impacting our sense of urgency to love more and live better. I am confident we have all learned something life-changing from the past year.

As we look forward to the future namely the next year of being God's people at St. Andrew's I look forward to the fruit of our listening and seeing from recent months. What has God revealed to you through this tough year? What has God revealed to the Church? How do we now action what we have seen and heard God reveal? Whatever that might be – we will do it together – with God's help all the way.

THANK YOU for all your work this past year. All who have been involved with rosters and duties, all our church committees and volunteers have helped make St. Andrew's what it is today.

With God's help we made it through. God's love and mercy is why we are still here today. Let us not take the life we have today for granted. LIVE.

On the 13th of December 2019, StAND youth went on a holiday for the Christmas and New Year season and returned on the 1st of March 2020.



At the beginning of 2020, leadership team met and deliberated on what we want as a leadership team to achieve with the young people for the new year. As a result, the following vision statement was produced as a goal for StAND Youth.

"Our vision for StAND Youth 2020 is for our young people to build character through service, through His Word and devotion, to say less and stand, through relationships and staying connected"

Youth evenings was held almost every Friday at the church hall and were tailored, since resuming in 2020, to achieve the goals above, however by the end of March we saw a change in our plans with the COVID19 lockdown nearing, ending all physical meetings or youth evenings. However, God will always plan things to perfection than we can ever hope for and as of April 2020, StAND Youth switched to an online platform "Zoom" to continue with Youth Evenings. Online meetings continued throughout till mid-June.

Online meetings were based around the Wednesday Devotionals content that were created by Reverend Gary Mauga. This was an opportunity for StAND Youth to discover the Good News in depth and provide insight to questions posed for each session from the comforts of their own homes.



During lockdown, on top of StAND Youth meetings, youth also contributed to Mother's Day Celebration by creating a dedication video for all the mothers of St Andrews Henderson.

Further to this, for the passing of our dearest church mother Jean-Pascoe, StAND Youth created a second video to send our warmest regards to the Robinson and Pascoe families as we could not be there physically. Once lockdown lifted, Jean Pascoe's family held a memorial service of which was well attended by StAND Youth together with members of our Parish.

On the 22nd of April 2020, StAND Youth launched its new Instagram Page to provide a wider platform for the youth to interact with each other while lockdown was in place. Shortly following its launch, Insta Takeovers were introduced as a form of engaging content that will allow the youth to learn more about each other and provide insight into each other's daily lives. This is an ongoing series as each member of the youth have yet to bless us with their lives.









At the end of June 2020, StAND Youth returned to church for the first time since lockdown for a Games night before School Holidays of which StAND Youth also emulated and took as a break. On the 31st of July, StAND Youth returned from School Holidays with its first Youth Evening bible study session led by the leaders and Rev Gary Mauga. During the school holidays, youth leaders regrouped to refocus the intention for StAND Youth for the remainder of 2020. In addition, it was decided that instead of weekly Youth Evenings, meets will be fortnightly on Friday evenings.

Additionally, the leaders in conjunction with the Faithbuilder's leaders commenced planning for White Sunday of which StAND Youth will participate in October 2020.

StAND Youth have always participated in the daily life of St Andrew's Henderson Presbyterian via volunteering and presence inside and outside of church. Weekly, youth members can be seen in the kitchen helping with morning tea or serving our elderly. In addition, members continue to volunteer for prayers, PowerPoint operating and helping with cleaning and flowers. Outside of church, members of StAND Youth also volunteer for the Church Op Shop during their spare time.

Mainly Music Report

We meet each Wednesday at 10am in the Church for our Mainly Music session then progress to the hall for morning tea and a playgroup activity then back to the church for the children to play. We are a registered playgroup with the Ministry of Education therefore receive funding. Our registration expires shortly, and the Ministry of Education are visiting and checking we are compliant and meet all the playgroup requirements to have a new licence for another 3 years. We also come under the Mainly Music umbrella and pay a monthly levy to them and receive support and training from them in return.

We currently have 35 children on our roll and the last few weeks had about 25 children attending on a Wednesday morning. I have just completed Ministry of Education Statistics to the 30 June 2020. We have children attending from different ethnic groups such as Maori, Samoan, Chinese, Japanese, South African and the majority being NZ European. We still attract caregivers that sometimes have 4 children in their care. Our Mums that come with their children generally just have 1 child attending MM.

We are very lucky to have a dedicated and talented team, but we are always after more helpers. Our team this year has consisted of Gary Mauga, Suliana Mauga, Catherine Connell, Grant Connell, Donna Teale, Isabel Clarke, Michelle Robinson, Bob Kerr, Tuteru Leavasa and Pava Saifoloi. We are very blessed to have one of our Mums Donna Teale lead our weekly Music Sessions. Donna also comes with a preschool background. Donna's Mum Linda also comes weekly and joins in with Donna's daughter Mackenzie.

We have many wonderful Wednesday Music Sessions. It's great to see the children joining in and learning the actions. Many children start off shy and gradually over time get more confident. Church Shop Report

The Church Shop is situated at 9 Trading Place, Henderson, and has been operating since September 1984. Grant, Catherine, Anne and Toots are responsible for the day to day running of the shop.

We sell a wide range of good quality second-hand (and a few new) items including clothing, jewellery, bric-a-brac, household goods, books and furniture. There are always treasures to be found. We depend on the generosity of Church members and the public for donations of goods. We have had to continue to turn away donations of clothing because we are overstocked.

Our voluntary helpers are Fia Mitimite (Henderson PIPC); Fatima Bajoutah, Grant and Catherine Connell, Mairi Ferguson, Toots Leavasa, Fou Purcell, Pava and Jan Saifoloi, Afoa and Violet Tu'uga

Stevenson and Anne Verry (St Andrew's); Doreen Blakely, Hilda Evans, Raewyn Rooke and Meryle Smillie (supportive friends). We appreciated Rebecca Wilson helping during the school holidays. An extra hand makes all the difference. We desperately need more helpers, particularly at times when staff members are away.

During February our sales were very low, so much so that we made a loss.

Because of Covid-19 the shop was closed from 24 March and reopened on 15 June. Since reopening we are very pleased that our sales have increased, but because of the reduced hours caused by lack of staff, we are not as viable as we should be.

We now have new opening hours – 10.00am to 2.00pm on Mondays to Thursdays, and we are closed on Fridays. On Saturdays we are open from 10.00am to 12.00pm.

We have two new professional looking signs which can be seen from a distance and draw attention to the shop. We thank Hilda Evans for arranging with a very kind neighbour to produce the signs free of charge.

In December Ailsa stepped down as coordinator, and from working at the shop. We are very grateful to Ailsa for all her time and effort put into the shop over many years. She covered hundreds of coat hangers which add to the attractiveness of the shop. Customers often comment on them.

In June the shop leaked badly. This has been an ongoing problem, but this time more damage was done. We spent a lot of time moving items to a dry space. We have contacted the Auckland Council (the new owners) several times, but so far, no repairs have been made. Our congregation needs to show more interest in the shop. If you are unable to help, come and visit us. Please let your families and friends know where we are and encourage them to come and have a look at what we sell.

The shop is a very important outreach in our community. Some customers come in regularly just to have a chat. We offer a listening ear, support and encouragement.

We are extremely grateful to all our staff members for their time and dedication. Everyone's contribution, no matter how small, is very much appreciated.

Treasurers Report

There was an increase in our direct giving this year as more people joined the scheme, particularly during the period of lockdown. Our overall offerings have increased by \$2763. Many thanks to everyone for their continuing support and commitment. The shop income was well down on the previous year due to the lockdown and reduced hours of opening. Many thanks to all the time and effort put in by the staff. Phoenix House income remains constant. These are two vital sources of income. Without them the parish would not be viable.

We would again encourage more people to take on direct giving either by automatic payment or direct credit, as this is an easy, regular way of offering. We would also remind you that the limit on tax rebates for charitable giving has been lifted, so we would ask you to consider giving your rebate to the Church for an even higher return the next year.

We were fortunate to receive a wage subsidy of \$7030.00 which was of great assistance in continuing to pay our minister while we were unable to hold our usual services.

The annual St Andrew's Day appeal boosted our funds by \$2065.00. This event is held each year as a special way to support the Church.

This year we started on our series of fundraising activities ably led by members of the Property and Finance Committee, only to be halted by the Covid-19 outbreak. Many thanks to all those involved with getting this work done. The money raised went to keeping our Church going over these unusual times.

We still continue to meet in full our commitments to General Assembly and Northern Presbytery. The General Assembly Levy, however, was reduced by two months in response to the pandemic.

Thank you once again to everyone for their continuing commitment and support. Your contributions are much needed if we are to continue to be a viable parish with a full-time Minister.
