

# PROPERTY & FINANCE REPORTS



# PROPERTY REPORT

All praise and honour be to our heavenly father for his love and endurance over us during the past couple of years COVID and its impacts. My report covers the period 01/11/21 - 30/09/22.



#### REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

#### **CHURCH BUILDING**

#### August 2021

All worship spaces under the Presbytery were required to undergo a seismic assessment to assessment as part of a broader strategy into the health of Church buildings. Cost: \$1,885.89 incl. gst.

#### December 2021

Modem upgrade to the electricity meter. Part of maintenance program to future proof the advanced meter. Cost: Free of charge.

Major flooding in Church foyer and men's toilet due heavy downpour. Church roof requires repair to stop this from occurring

# April 2022

2 roofing companies engaged to provide quoting to repair roof. Asbestos noted in hall roof, repairs required to roof gulley and replacement of internal gutters. Repairs estimated to be \$39,100 + an additional \$10,000+ if it is found that the existing structure of the roof is not up to code.

#### June 2022

- Engaged Cunny Atchison (Convenor, Presbytery Property & Finance) to realise options for funding for the roof. Property & Finance start discussions about possible options to fund the roof and do major renovations to both the Church and associated properties.
- Engaged Trust Investments Management Limited to obtain property advice.

### **July 2022**

Cost of lawnmowing increased to \$135 per visit (from \$126.50)

# September 2022

Property & Insurance Review by Presbytery Property & Finance to better understanding of the overall state and requirements of property (land and buildings) into the future.

#### **PHOENIX HOUSE**

#### March 2022

- Dummy Cameras installed at Phoenix House. Thank you to Linda and Tony Johns for donating and installing the cameras.
- Outside leaking tap at Phoenix House found running continuously warned of a huge water bill to keep an eye on.

#### **MANSE**

#### May 2022

- Oven issue warrant replacement. New oven purchased. Cost: \$1,244.92. Thank you to Ian & Michelle Robinson for donating \$1,000 to replace the oven.
- Replacement of 2 lighting fixtures. Cost: \$701.20
- Replacement of 4 lighting fixtures and sensor light. Cost: \$1,027.50
- Many thanks to the Linda Johns and Saifoloi family for donating \$1,000 to cover the cost of the electrical repairs.

#### **July 2022**

- A longstanding leak causing rot in bathroom needs to be repaired. Repairs estimated to be \$9,200.00 + an additional \$3,000+ if rot is more extensive.
- Printer lease with Sharp has expired. A decision was made to purchase a new printer for the manse office upfront to save costs. New printer is purchased outright. Cost: \$858.00. Expected savings in FY23: ~\$170 per month.

# August 2022

Manse washing machine fault noted. Will need to repair or replace, cost TBC

#### **WORKING BEES**

No working bees held since COVID lockdown, however requests from Phoenix House to clear Phoenix Palms and gutters to be cleared.

On behalf of the Property & Finance team, I would like to extend our thanks to all our generous parishioners who donated funds toward helping get issues of maintenance sorted and helping families in need during the tough times as experienced in the last few months. We pray for God's healing, His never-ending love, and thank Him for the blessings he continues to shower over us in our time of need. We pray for healing amongst those who are suffering and for comfort to those who has lost loved ones in the past year.

# TREASURER REPORT

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

I open by acknowledging the efforts of my predecessor, Grant Connell, who served faithfully in this role for 25 years, officially completing his term as Treasurer at the conclusion of the last financial year. In this time, Grant made sure that all Church funds were spent wisely as well as ensuring that all payments and reports were made on time, every time. I have been very grateful to be able to tap into his wealth of knowledge throughout this past year as well.



#### Summary

Like the previous year, 90% of the income covered all our expenses. As such, we ended the year with a modest surplus of \$11,870 (\$11,314 in FY21).

# Total Income (\$117, 820)

- Total offerings increased by 27% (\$14,000). Offerings remain our largest source of income and accounted for 58% of the total income in FY22.
- Total rental income from Phoenix House was \$24,150 and will remain the same at least until the lease expires in October 2023). The rental income sourced from Phoenix House accounted for 21% of the total income in FY22.
- The Wage Subsidy received during the lockdown was \$8,400.

#### **Total Expenses (\$105,950)**

- Ministerial expenses (Stipend which includes PAYE, Beneficiary Fund, Consulting and Travel Allowance) accounted for 60% of the total expenses in the year. This is a necessary expense to ensure we continue to have a full-time Minister.
- Regular expenses accounted for 33% of our total expenses. These include utilities, office expenses, insurance and repairs and maintenance.

A statement of assets and a breakdown of each of our accounts follows this report, with a detailed breakdown of our general (operational) account.



## The Year Ahead

Heading into FY23, the income budget assumes a 2% increase due to new Parishioners and (fingers crossed) an increase in regular giving across the board. The expense budget reflects a 4% general increase across all Ministerial and regular expenses – a modest assumption considering that annual CPI as at end June was 7.3%. We should expect to see some cost savings in FY23 because of the disconnection of the Church landline, purchasing a new office printer (by ending the lease with Sharp) as well as an insurance review that may result in a cheaper premium going forward. However, if we are unable to match the increase in expenses, we may end up with a deficit at the end of FY23, so my humble request is that we pull together in any way that we can to keep our Church going and allow us to reach our long-term goals of a new building.



FY22 was a year that highlighted the huge generosity from you, our Parishioners, and our visitors. Though a series of COVID-19 restrictions hampered any of our efforts to gather in person, you continued to contribute financially to the life of the Church to keep things going and it has given us a good result. Thank you all.
