"Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples..."



On Sunday 19th February this year St Andrew's parish commissioned Ministry Intern John and his wife Eseta Setu. A covenant was made between the Knox Centre for Ministry and Leadership (KCML) and our parish agreeing to a two-year practical ministry internship with the Setu's.

What a privilege it has been so far to witness and contribute to this ministry journey by which the blessings have flowed both ways. As a parish we have rallied around the Setu family offering support and friendship, experience, and faith in our commitment to them. But it is more than just our commitment to the Setu's. In trust and faith, we look forward to the growth and development of our current Ministry Intern John and Eseta.

This is a testament to the commitment and hearts of our parish to the wider mission of God in this world. We have been given these unique opportunities to help shape and mould disciples who will go on to lead and bless others but most importantly: to bring knowledge and awareness of the kingdom and the name of God.

THANK YOU, ST. ANDREW'S PARISH AND FAMILIES, for all your work this past year 2022-23. Everyone has played a part whether big or small and I can only urge you to continue to take up opportunities to serve the church in some way. - Gary acknowledged the three members of the Parish who are attending the Preaching classes.



Talofa & Greetings to you all in the mighty name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.


We are now into the eighth month of 2023, and we are appreciative for everything we have accomplished thus far and intended to accomplish since 2022.

STAND YOUTH



PROPERTY REPORT

Our Team: Talatuvae Jan Saifoloi, Taulealeausumai Violet Tuuga Stevenson, Michelle Robinson, Papua Taumate and Helen Tuuga Stevenson

Talofa and greetings to you all in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. We are in trying times and have been truly blessed to have made it through with the grace of God in the work we continue to do for our parish of St Andrews Presbyterian Church.



STAND-UP PROJECT

While this isn't progressing as fast as we'd hoped, we are still moving forward. To date we have received the following reports to realise the work that is required to redevelop our Church properties:

- Conditions and Scope of Work Report (Octa Project Management, report pending August 2023): looking at the
 current conditions of the Church and Church properties detailing all the work required to bring each building to
- **Trust Management Report (February 2023):** looking at the different options we can consider as part of this project (to move to a 'green site', a 'brown site' or redevelop the existing property. As a Parish Council and Church, it was agreed in March 2023 that we would look into the redevelopment of the existing site.
- **Property Assessment Report (November 2022):** completed in part to assist CPT with developing a paper to the General Assembly on 'fit for purpose buildings', this report looks at the overall state and requirements of each building held by the Presbytery.
- Seismic Assessment Report (December 2021)

Next steps:

- Receive and discuss report from Octa Project Management. Meet with Presbytery Property & Finance to discuss and understand any funding opportunities.



REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

My report covers the period 01/10/22 - 30/06/23.

CHURCH BUILDING

November 2022

- Water bill has increased substantially, possibly an unidentified leak. Enquiries made with Watercare.
- Lawnmowing \$135.00

December 2022

- Artwork Reframing: The Lord's Prayer and The Lords Supper were re-framed and new plaques applied. Total cost \$888.20. Reframed artwork was completed and dedicated on Sunday 19th Feb 2023. Thank you to all who had donated towards this cost.
- Lawnmowing: \$270.00
- Working Bee: 13x chairs to be repaired. Work to be scheduled later. Debris cleared, water blasting of gutters and buildings, trimming down of the hedges along the driveway. Trailer loads and Flexi Bags used to take away excess trimmings and branches.

January 2023

- Extensive flooding continues. Gutters cleaned out again and sweeping of rising water to the front entrance of the church building. Leak in the foyer ceiling has affected the electrical system, light bulbs, and roof damage. Once dried out new light fittings were installed. Total cost: \$245.94
- Lawnmowing \$270.00

February 2023

- Leak detection services employed to identify leak causing high water bills. Found water meter broken. This was later repaired. Total cost \$772.50
- Lawnmowing \$270.00

March 2023

- Security Lights outside Church suffered a lamp failure. Total cost \$245.21
- Lawnmowing \$270.00

April 2023

- Church vacuum cleaner no longer working. After assessing, it was agreed to buy a new one, as it was not feasible to repair the old one. A new vacuum was donated by the Mase family which we were truly thankful for.
- Lawnmowing \$270.00

May 2023

- Insurance valuation undertaken by Prendos NZ Ltd. Total cost \$1,552.50
- Lawnmowing \$270.00

June 2023

Lawnmowing \$270.00

PHOENIX HOUSE

October 2022

Lease renewal. This was formalized from the current agreement to a deed of lease. Total cost approx. \$3,600.

March 2023

Phoenix House Lease signed and renewed. No change to lease amount. Ends 30 September 2023.

June 2023

- Roofing quotes sought to repair Phoenix House ceiling. Quote approx. \$37k.
- Lease renewal process underway.

MANSE

April 2023

- Bathroom light repairs. Total cost \$125.22

FINANCE REPORT

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

SUMMARY



We ended the year with a modest surplus of \$11,770 (\$11,870 in FY22). Included within the surplus are the amounts we have deducted monthly to cover the cost of the annual insurance bill (currently \$900 per month) which is issued every August. Deducting this amount will leave us with a true surplus of \$1,171.73.

Total Income (\$135,010)

- Total offerings in 2022 was \$79,040 (up 15% on the previous year). Offerings remain our largest source of income and accounted for 58% of the total income in FY23.
- Total rental income from Phoenix House was \$24,150 (no change from last year). The rental income sourced from Phoenix House is our second largest source of income and accounted for 18% of the total income in FY23.
- We received \$7,380 in donations throughout the year, which was largely sourced from our Parish Members to assist towards specific events and occasions (e.g., koha for Parishioners who have suffered property or personal loss).
- Total hireage income from Henderson PIPC was \$6,500. This amount will increase in the coming year following the new revised agreement (effective March 2023)

Total Expenses (\$123,240)

- Ministerial expenses (Stipend which includes PAYE, Beneficiary Fund, Consulting and Travel Allowance) accounted for 57% of the total expenses this year. These are necessary expense to ensure we continue to have a full-time Minister.
- Regular expenses accounted for 30% of our total expenses. These include utilities, office expenses, insurance, Presbytery Fees and repairs and maintenance.

A statement of assets and a breakdown of each of our accounts follows this report, with a detailed breakdown of our general (operational) account.

The YEAR AHEAD



Heading into FY24, the income budget assumes a 2% increase due to new Parishioners and (fingers crossed) an increase in regular giving across the board. The expense budget reflects a 4% general increase across all Ministerial and regular expenses – which is slightly above forecasted CPI of 3.3%.

We should expect to see a small lift in income due to the increase in Henderson PIPC's rental agreement and the increase in hireage donation from mainly music. We might also see some possible cost savings due to a credit on the water rates at the beginning of the year and a lower insurance premium based on a recent insurance valuation.

However, we will see increases in expenses each year based on inflation, and if we are unable to match the increase in expenses, we may end up with a deficit at the end of FY23. We may also see an increase in repairs and maintenance as our Parish Council prioritise the growing list of maintenance concerns that must eventually be done to keep our aging worship space safe.

As always, my humble request is that we pull together in any way that we can to keep our Church going and allow us to reach our long-term goals of a new building.



For yet another year, the finances highlight the huge generosity from you, our Parishioners, and our visitors. As the cost of living increases, you continue to contribute financially to the life of the Church to keep things going. Nga mihi nui ki a koutou! Looking forward to another year in God's grace.
